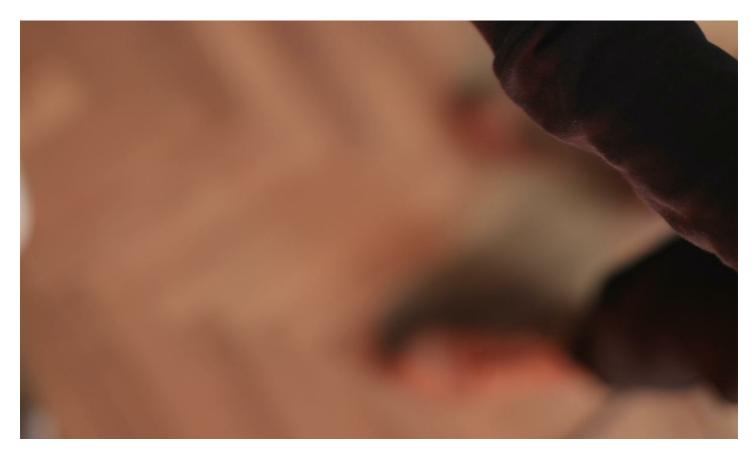


Jennifer C. Persico Speaks on Women's Empowerment Session Panel Hosted by ECMC's Office of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion
